

Grant Overview

This report provides a baseline of CMHC's reach prior to opioid abatement funding to compare to future evaluations.



Grantee: Centennial Mental Health Center (CMHC)



Initial Allocation Amount: \$156,602.32



Funding Purposes: The project expands secure transportation services to include demand response services to transport individuals seeking voluntary admission into substance use disorder in-patient services, such as residential treatment and/or detoxification and withdrawal management.



Funding Use Details: These services will be provided "one way" to service facilities outside of Centennial Mental Health Center's (CMHC) defined catchment area of Cheyenne, Elbert, Kit Carson, Lincoln, Logan, Morgan, Phillips, Sedgwick, Washington, and Yuma counties. If the service facility is inside CMHC's defined catchment area, they will coordinate return transportation. Additionally, CMHC intends to expand transportation services to include transportation to and from outpatient substance use services, including MAT, Individual Outpatient Therapy, Outpatient Groups, and Relapse Prevention for residents of the communities of Sterling in Logan County and Fort Morgan in Morgan County.

Clients Served


From January 1, 2023, through June 30, 2023, CMHC served 696 total clients and provided over 12,000 services.


Demographics

Demographics for clients served by secure transportation between July 1, 2023, and September 30, 2023.



Current Transportation Services

From July 1, 2023, to September 30, 2023, CMHC provided Secure Transportation services to 94 clients. Clients were substance-involved at the time of transport and transported to detox or inpatient psychiatric care. CMHC was not providing Non-Emergent Medical Transport Services at that time.
