Reports

- Extension: There won't be division shows together. If people want to sponsor divisions they can but will be awarded in the regular classes. Weigh in is on May 3. Concern over how many animals will need to run through the ring on beef/sheep/goat/bucket calf show day.
- Rodeo: Indian relay is tabled—too costly. Expenses will be up 12,000-14,000 this year.
- Fair Queen: Have been in Idalia participating in a reading week and held the Cattleman's Calcutta/Cajun Boil. There will be a gymkhana in Holyoke on May 31.
- Event Manager: Mexican concert is a go they sent Scott paperwork. The code of conduct
 was discussed and the board asked for the final paragraph that discusses removal of kids
 based on parents conduct to be removed. We will operate on having a meeting with board
 members and superintendents as need arises. BJ moved to price tickets for the concerts at
 \$20. Micah seconded and motion passed.
- Fairgrounds- Mics are fixed in the show ring and the crows nest system would be fixed this week. Working on getting TV's to show in ring behind announcers booth.
- Commissioners: The big orange panels are getting sold. Hope to work on Home Ec building next year. There are issues with the new AC system.
- Sponsorship: Letters are out and sponsorships are coming in.
- Vendor: Discussed costs to vendors and wanted to play around with dropping prices on some and raising machinery stall costs. Hoping to keep the same revenue coming in but entice more vendors.
