## Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) Program

**Application submission deadline: April 20, 2026**

**Purpose:** The purpose of this program is to facilitate the implementation of AOT for adults with serious mental illness (SMI). Recipients are expected to implement the AOT program, working with civil courts, community partners, and other entities to support community-based treatment for adults with SMI who meet criteria for AOT.

**Funding Amount :** \$500,000-\$750,000

**Eligibility:** Eligibility is statutorily limited to counties, cities, mental health systems (including mental health authorities), mental health courts, or any other entities with authority under the law of the State in which the applicant is located to implement, monitor and oversee assisted outpatient programs

## Adult Treatment Court Program

**Deadline:** Monday, April 27, 2026

**Purpose:** This program provides grants and technical assistance to enhance the operations of adult treatment courts (ATCs). Courts should integrate evidence-based substance use treatment, mandatory drug testing, sanctions and incentives, offender management, and aftercare services in judicially-supervised court settings with jurisdiction over offenders to reduce recidivism, increase access to treatment and recovery support, and prevent overdoses.

**Funding Amount:** \$950K (planning and implementation), \$1M (Enhancement), \$2.5M (Statewide)

**Eligibility:** Eligible Category 1 and Category 2 applicants include: State and territorial governments, County, city, and township governments, Federally recognized Native American tribal governments, Towns, boroughs, parishes, villages, or other general purpose political subdivisions of a state. Eligible Category 3 applicants are state agencies, which include the state-administering agency (SAA).
